CURRENTLY

Billy is the Director of Aquatics and the National Swim Coach for the Island of Palau. As part of his duties, Billy provides regular clinic and training sessions for elementary school children in addition to visiting remote islanders to educate them in life saving practices. Billy has shared his knowledge with people on a score of islands throughout Polynesia and Micronesia. Billy is also the FINA Commissioner for Open Water Swimming representing the Pacific Rim and coached the USA Team in a recent open water competition.

He has taken this small county and managed to triple the size of the swim team while persuading the US Navy to assist him in refurbishing their national pool. In 2016 Billy coached two of his swimmers at the Olympics in Rio. Billy returned to Olympic action coaching at the 2021 Games in Tokyo.

In addition to the Olympics, Billy's swimmers have competed successfully in Pan Pacific Games, Youth Olympics, World Championships and FINA sponsored events around the world.

Billy has earned the highest (Level 5, Olympic) coaching accreditation granted by the International Swimming Federation (FINA) and the American Swimming Coaches Association (ASCA).

He works closely with FINA and is always looking to encourage and get others into aquatic sports, while guiding them to be all they can be.
